**FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN**

This story is being sent around on the internet. I don't know if its true, but it is revealing. In Mt. Vernon, Texas, Drummond's Bar began construction on an expansion of their building to increase their business. In response, a local church (denomination to remain unnamed) started a campaign to block the bar from expanding with petitions and prayers. Work progressed right up until the week before the grand reopening when lightning struck the bar and it burned to the ground. After the bar burning the church folks were rather smug in their outlook, bragging about "the power of prayer," until the bar owner sued the church on the grounds that the church "was ultimately responsible for the demise of his building, either through direct or indirect actions or means". In its reply to the court, the church vehemently denied all responsibility or any connection to the building's demise. The judge read through the plaintiff's complaint and the defendant's reply and at the opening hearing, commented, "I don't know how I'm going to decide this, but it appears from the paperwork that we have a bar owner who believes in the power of prayer, and an entire congregation that now does not. This leads me to the conclusion that I don't know if God will be answering many more prayers for this congregation any time soon!"
