As I metaphorically put pen to paper (really I am on a Mac putting fingers to keyboard!) and compose this last "Write Reverend" at Aldersgate, I am reminded of one of the great hymns of the church and the events that inspired its writing. The hymn is John Fawcett's "Blest Be the Tie." Fawcett wrote this hymn in response to his last minute decision not to leave the small and poor church he and his wife had faithfully served for a more lucrative position and prestigious pulpit in London. As they loaded the last wagon with their possessions, his wife, as the story goes, told him she felt they ought not leave this parish. Fawcett agreed and they ordered the wagon unloaded and their furniture was joyously returned to the house. Fawcett sent a letter to the church in London, saying he could not come. Fawcett had begun his journey with Christ as a Methodist, but later joined the Baptist church where he had the luxury of deciding personally his place of service. Our itinerant system does not give us that luxury, but the itinerancy does not

limit forming relationships that transcend place and time and bind us together in Christian love. The last verse of this great hymn says:

> When we asunder part, It gives us inward pain; But we shall still be joined in heart, And hope to meet again.

We often have little or no control over the daily challenges we face. We do, however, have some say over how we respond to those circumstances. Our faith does not leave us without resources in dealing with sadness when we are called to part and go our different ways. Horatio Spafford, a devout Chicago lawyer, was inspired to write some of the most memorable lines in our tradition at the spot where his four daughters went down with the ship they traveled in to Europe:

When peace, like a river, attendeth my way, when storm clouds like sea billows roll;

whatever my lot, thou has taught me to say, It is well, it is well with my soul

Finally, I would share the words of Memphis schoolteacher Lucy E. Campbell, inspired by an encounter with a homeless man on a cold and snowy day. Ms. Campbell says the man was wrapped in rags and sat on the curb. playing a beautiful and captivating melody on a harmonica. She asked him: "How can you play like that, sitting here in the cold, wrapped in rags?" "I don't know," said the man, "its just something within me." Inspired by this encounter, Ms. Campbell wrote:

Have you that something, that burning desire? Have you that something, that never doth tire?

- Oh, if you have it that Heavenly Fire! Then let the world know there is something within. Something within, that holdeth the reins, Something within, that banishes pain;
 - Something within me I cannot explain, All that I know there is something within.
